Emergency & First Aid Procedures :

Eyes:	Flush eyes with water for at least 15 minutes. remove contact lenses. Get medical attention if irritation persists.
Skin:	Remove contaminated clothing. Wash skin thoroughly with soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation persists. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse.
Ingestion:	Do not induce vomiting. Drink one or two glasses of water to dilute product. Get medical attention. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.
Inhalation:	Move person to fresh air. Get medical attention if irritation persists.
